Osteopathic medicine is a unique form of American medical care developed in 1874 by Andrew Taylor Still, M.D., D.O. Osteopathic physicians (D.O.s) embrace a holistic philosophy, considering the body as a unit of interrelated systems that work together to ensure optimal health.

Today, approximately 70,000 D.O.s actively practice in the United States, and 100 million patient visits are made to D.O.s each year. As fully licensed doctors, D.O.s practice traditional forms of medicine in primary care and specialties, prescribe medications, and perform surgery.

More than half of all D.O.s practice in these primary care areas:

- general practice
- internal medicine
- obstetrics/gynecology
- pediatrics



## D.O.S & M.D.S

Osteopathic physicians receive additional training that offers a therapeutic and diagnostic advantage in practice. D.O.s regard the body as an integrated whole and receive specialized musculoskeletal training that provides a better understanding of the ways that an injury or illness in one part of the body can affect another. Additionally, D.O.s are trained in Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment, using their hands to diagnose injury and illness and to encourage the body's natural tendency toward good health.




D.O.s M.D.s

typically enter medical school with four-year degrees
with emphasis on scientific course work

- complete four years of basic medical education
- can choose to practice in a specialty area of medicine
- must pass national and state licensing examinations to legally practice medicine
- practice in fully accredited and licensed hospitals and medical centers
  - practice a whole person approach to medicine
  - can apply for either allopathic or osteopathic internship and residency programs
- receive specialized training in the musculoskeletal system the body's interconnected system of nerves, muscles, and bones
  - incorporate Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment (OMT) into training and practice
